

**General Terms and Conditions (GTC)
of to event organization services
provided by Current Society Kft.**

Current Society Kft. [Registered office: 1016 Budapest, Naphegy utca 15. mf 3. ajtó, Company registration number: 01 09 447701, Tax No: 32884300-2-41, MKEH (Hungarian Energy and Public Utility Regulatory Authority) License No: U00210, Represented by: Gábor Sájer, Managing Director (hereinafter referred to as the Service Provider) provides event organization services to its Clients (hereinafter referred to as the Client) under framework contracts and purchase orders.

1. Scope

The scope of this GTC extends to all services provided by the Service Provider, the process of the cooperation, regulates the process of concluding a contract with Clients and content of the contract, the rights and obligations of the parties, the causes of termination of the contract, as well as issues related to liability and data controlling.

For the purposes of these GTC, contracts shall include Purchase Orders concluded in writing between the parties for the ordered Services, which the Service Provider shall provide the Client with the Services specified therein (hereinafter: Purchase Order). A contract is also concluded upon the Client's written acceptance of the price quotation prepared by the Service Provider, as well as upon the acceptance of a framework agreement concluded by the parties (hereinafter: Framework Agreement) and the Purchase Orders placed on the basis thereof (hereinafter collectively: Contract).

By signing the Contract concluded with the Service Provider, the Client agrees to be bound by the provisions of these GTC. The Client and the Service Provider may deviate from the provisions of the GTC upon mutual agreement in writing. Unless otherwise provided for in the Contract, the provisions of the GTC shall apply even if not expressly referred to. In the event of any discrepancy between the Contract concluded between the Service Provider and the Client and the GTC, the provisions of the Contract shall prevail.

In matters not regulated by the GTC and the Contract, the provisions of the Hungarian laws, official regulations, and duly published international conventions and standards in effect at any time and from time to time shall apply. These GTC shall take effect upon publication on the Service Provider's website.

Basic types of services

- 2.1. Event organization in Hungary and abroad, including
- 2.2. booking accommodation for events
- 2.3. travel arrangements related to events
- 2.4. PR and other planning tasks related to events
- 2.5. preparation of online platforms related to events
- 2.6. providing personnel for events

3. General rules of cooperation

3.1. Preparation of a price quotation

Before concluding the contract, in order to ensure successful performance thereof, the Client shall request a price quotation from the Service Provider, either in writing or, if necessary, in the course of a personal meeting. The main purpose of requesting a price quotation is outline the tasks to the Service Provider. It is important for the Service Provider to understand the circumstances of the event and the Client's needs and objectives. The Client is requested to determine the main specifications of the event, and the Service Provider is required to determine the conditions under which they can undertake it. Main specifications:

- tasks to be performed — subject of the services
- number of participants
- other information about the participants and their composition
- date of the event
- requirements regarding the venue
- budget (if applicable)

- planned program, time frame (professional and leisure)
- other relevant information arising from the nature of the event.
- cancellation policy
- payment terms

The Service Provider undertakes to use its expertise and experience to prepare a customized offer for the Client. If the offer do not meet the Client's expectations, the Client may request the Service Provider to modify the offer after specifying its requirements. The content of the offer constitutes the intellectual property of the Service Provider. If the Client organizes the event specified in the offer prepared by the Service Provider with the involvement of another service provider or on its own without involving the Service Provider, the Service Provider shall be entitled to a fee of 10% of the total amount of the offer.

3.2. Term of the Offer

Unless otherwise stated, the Service Provider's offer and price quotation shall be valid for seven (7) days from the date of communication to the Client, which means that the Service Provider shall be bound by the offer until the expiration of the seven (7) day deadline. The Service Provider shall indicate this **as the expiration of the deadline** in its offer. Within this period, the Client may order the recommended services with the conditions specified in the offer; after the expiration of this period, the Service Provider's binding offer shall cease to be valid. The Client may request an extension of the deadline in writing, in which case the Service Provider shall confirm in writing whether the deadline can be extended and, if so, under what conditions.

3.3. Placing and order and concluding a contract

The Client shall send the duly signed Purchase Order (signed by a company representative, if applicable), to the Service Provider electronically, by post, by fax or in person, but in any case in writing.

The Contract between the Service Provider and the Client shall be concluded on the basis of the final price quotation and shall contain the following:

- a detailed description of the services,
- the obligations of the Service Provider,
- the obligations of the Client,
- the fee for the services ordered,
- the fee payable to the Service Provider,
- the payment terms,
- the cancellation terms,
- any other provisions.

The Service Provider is not required to verify that the Purchase Order and/or contract has been signed by an authorized representative of the Client.

3.3.1. Detailed description of the services

The Parties shall specify the following issues in the contract:

- the tasks to be performed and the deadlines thereof
- where applicable, prepare a detailed program, which forms part of the Contract

If the services requested by the Client should change, the Client shall immediately notify the Service Provider, and the Service Provider shall confirm its acceptance, if necessary, by modifying the offer. If the offer is modified after a contract has been concluded, the

the modified offer and its written confirmation by the Client shall form part of the contract.

3.3.2. Obligations of the Service Provider

The Service Provider's tasks and obligations shall be specified in detail by the parties in the Contract or in the order, which may vary depending on the event. The Service Provider undertakes to organize, prepare, and conduct the event to the best of its knowledge, to keep the Client informed at all times, and to draw the Client's attention to any professional, ethical, or other difficulties that may arise in connection with the Client's request.

The parties shall cooperate in the selection of subcontractors, additional service providers, venues, performers, etc., but the Service Provider shall not be responsible for the quality and suitability of the services provided by the subcontractors selected by the Client.

3.3.3. Obligations of the Client

The Client's duties and responsibilities are set out in detail in the Contract, which vary depending on the event.

The Client undertakes to share all necessary information with the Service Provider in a timely manner for the successful organization of the event, to actively participate in the selection of individual event elements within the deadline, and to make the necessary decisions by the deadline.

The Client shall also inform the Service Provider of all advertising media (banners, roll-ups, films, etc.) to be placed at the event venue, as well as the planned method of placement.

3.3.4. Fees for services

The Service Provider shall clearly communicate to the Client the fees for each service element (venue rental fees, catering, programs, transportation, accommodation, other services) and shall inform the Client of the terms and conditions thereof and, where applicable, of any restrictions or conditions to which they are subject.

3.3.5. Fees payable to the Service Provider

The Service Provider shall be paid a fee for the work performed, the amount of which shall be specified by the parties in the Purchase Order. In addition to the fee, the Service Provider shall be paid an agency commission of 10-15%, the amount of which shall be specified in the Purchase Order.

3.3.6. Terms of payment

The Service Provider shall issue an invoice in its own invoicing system after the conclusion of the event, which shall be sent to the Client by post or electronically.

The Client shall pay the invoice by bank transfer by the deadline specified in the Purchase Order.

If the volume and/or duration of the event so requires and the Service Provider owes an advance payment to the subcontractors involved, an advance payment may be requested in part or in full from the Client. The Service Provider may issue an invoice of such advance payment according to a pre-agreed payment schedule.

The Client shall provide the Service Provider with all information necessary for the payment of the invoice (PO number, cost center, etc.) before the end of the event.

3.3.6.1. Invoice complaints

The Client may submit any complaints regarding the invoices within two (2) working days of receipt of the invoice, only in writing, failing which the right to complain shall be forfeited. The Client may also submit complaints by sending an email to the Service Provider's email address. The Service Provider shall

examine the complaint within five (5) working days and notify the Client thereof. If the complaint is justified, the original payment deadline shall be calculated from the date of receipt of the new invoice. In the case of an invoice complaint, the Client is only entitled to withhold the disputed item until it has been clarified; the original payment deadline shall apply to the other items on the invoice that are correct.

3.3.6.2. Late payment

In the event of late payment, the Service Provider is entitled to charge default interest at the rate permitted by the Civil Code from the date on which the arrears accrued. In the event of late payment, the Client shall pay the Service Provider the default interest specified in the applicable laws and the flat-rate collection costs, based on the invoice issued automatically by the Service Provider without further notice.

3.3.7. Cancellation conditions

The parties confirm that the Service Provider orders services and concludes contracts with third parties and subcontractors on behalf of and at the request of the Client. The Service Provider shall make every effort to ensure that the cancellation terms and conditions of the subcontractors are already available at the time of concluding the contract with the Client, and that these are included in the offer and/or the Contract. If this is not the case, the Client agrees that if the Service Provider is required to pay a penalty due to the Client's partial or full cancellation (reduction in staff numbers), the Client shall be liable for this after verification.

4. Termination of the contract

- 4.1. The Contract concluded between the parties shall terminate when the services have been performed.
- 4.2. The contract concluded between the parties may be terminated before the performance of the services in the following cases:
 - 4.2.1. By mutual agreement between the parties.
 - 4.2.2. By cancellation or termination by the Client.

If the Client wishes to exercise its right of cancellation or termination, the Client shall compensate the Service Provider for any damages incurred, in particular as follows:

 - To assume the obligations already fulfilled by the Service Provider to third parties or undertaken in the contract and which cannot be cancelled without penalty.
 - Paying the Service Provider a proportionate part of the service fee. The "proportionate part" is determined by the time spent by the Service Provider on the organization of the event, which is determined by the parties based on the time from the conclusion of the contract to the end of the event.
 - 4.2.3. By cancellation or termination by the Service Provider. If the Service Provider wishes to exercise its right of cancellation or termination, the Client shall compensate the Client for the damages incurred, as follows:
 - The Service Provider may not transfer to the Client any obligations already fulfilled or agreed upon and which cannot be cancelled without penalty.
 - The Service Provider shall pay the Client a proportionate part of the service fee. The proportionate part shall be determined by the time spent by the Service Provider on the organization of the event, which shall be established by the parties on the basis of the period from the date of conclusion of the contract to the end of the event

- 4.2.4. If the Client delays the payment by more than thirty (30) days and fails to pay its debt despite a reminder,
 - 4.2.5. If bankruptcy or liquidation proceedings are initiated against the Client.
 - 4.2.6. If the Client commits a material breach of contract.
- 4.3. The termination or cancellation of the Contract for any reason shall not affect the obligations of the parties arising until the date of termination or their obligations to pay fees due.

5. Disclaimer

The Service Provider acts as an intermediary for the services provided by the subcontractors. In this regard, the Service Provider shall not be liable for any default, mistakes or omissions on the part of the contractors. At the same time, the Service Provider undertakes to act on behalf of the Client in compensating any damages suffered by the Client in order to enable the Client to enforce its claim for damages.

Furthermore, the Service Provider shall not be liable for any property damage justifiably caused by the Client's guests or employees at the event venue. The Client shall be fully liable for such damage.

6. Data controlling

The Service Provider is committed to protecting the personal data of the Client's business and employees, and considers it extremely important to respect their right to informational self-determination. The Service Provider represents that it respects the personal rights of its partners, Clients, and website visitors. It treats recorded personal data confidentially, in accordance with data protection laws and international recommendations, and takes all security, technical, and organizational measures to guarantee the security of the data.

The Service Provider shall use and disclose personal data to third parties solely and exclusively for the purpose of performing tasks arising from its scope of activity (performance).

The Service Provider protects the data with appropriate measures, in particular against unauthorized access, alteration, transmission, disclosure, deletion or destruction, as well as accidental destruction, damage, and inaccessibility resulting from changes in the technology used.

Detailed information on the processing of personal data is provided in a separate privacy notice. The Service Provider's privacy notice is continuously available on the Service Provider's website and provides detailed information on the scope of personal data processed, the purpose and legal basis of data processing, the duration of data processing, data transfers, and the rights and legal remedies of data subjects.

The Client is responsible for informing the data subjects about the controlling of their personal data in accordance with the provisions of the relevant legislation.

7. Force majeure

The Service Provider and the Client agree that neither party shall be liable for breach of contract in cases where unforeseeable circumstances beyond the control of both parties arise that prevent the performance of the contract (objective impossibility). Such circumstances include, but are not limited to: epidemics, acts of war, riots, sabotage, bombings, natural disasters, floods, fires, lightning strikes, other natural disasters, work stoppages, measures taken by authorities authorized under the National Defense Act, the Police Act, or other authorities with such powers.

8. Settlement of disputes

The Service Provider and the Client shall make every effort to settle any controversy or dispute arising between them in connection with the contract through negotiations. The parties shall inform each other in writing of any facts or circumstances that may hinder this.

In matters not regulated by the GTC and the Agreement, the applicable rules of Hungarian law, in particular the provisions of the Civil Code, shall be considered authoritative.
